About INNO INDIGO

INNO INDIGO

- is a European Union funded FP7 INCO ERA-Net
- running from November 2013 to April 2017
- bringing together 14 institutions
 - 11 from Europe: APRE, CNRS, DLR (coordinator), EBN, FCT, FWF, GAIA, NWO, TÜBITAK, ZSI, ETAG
 - 3 from India: CSIR, DBT, GITA
- working towards the goal of

supporting EU-India science, technology and innovation (STI) research cooperation in thematic areas of joint interest



Main Objectives

- Launch of joint calls on a regular basis: fund collaborative projects involving research organisations and industries
- Platform for funders: attract new funders (in particular regions), develop a self-sustaining funding mechanism
- Innovation:
 - more involvement of SMEs / industries / clusters
 - include social, inclusive, frugal innovation etc.
- Enhance visibility of opportunities for Indo-European scientific collaboration
- Ensure sustainability of collaboration
- Provide support to scale up Indo-European collaboration results
